# **Project Description**

**Nunavut's Canada 150 Project** will fund local celebrations in at least 10 Nunavut communities outside Iqaluit as the territory joins in the nation-wide year-long festivities. Do you have a vision of how to bring your fellow community members together for an event or collaboration in celebration of Canada—the past, present and/or future? Then apply to the Nunavut Canada 150 Fund!

### What's the call for?

We want to hear your **proposals for community events or project**s that capture one or more of Canada 150's four overarching themes. Those **themes** are:

- the environment
- engaging and inspiring youth
- reconciliation between Indigenous and non-Indigenous people, and
- diversity and inclusion.

#### Some ideas to inspire you:

- A community hunt and feast
- Youth and elders collect and share childhood stories or artistic practices
- A short film about your unique community
- Traditional skills workshops
- A music-as-therapy workshop and concert series
- A mural or other art project that represents your community
- A cultural exchange with another Canadian community
- A youth theatrical performance for a visiting cruise ship
- A celebration of the diverse cultures in your community with food, dance, music and other performances
- A project which celebrates or gets people engaged with the environment and landscape of your community

## **Up to \$25,000** per community will be awarded to projects or events that can:

- maximize the number of participants and volunteers
- draw on partnerships with other individuals or organizations
- create an event worthy of attention and pride
- foster positive community identity
- recognize and honour local heroes, places, events, customs
